ACHIEVEMENTS

1. IRS 501 (c) (3) Group Tax Exemption Program (GTEP) & Handbook (Rose Houk, Retired Attorney) An IRS group tax exemption umbrella was achieved (March 10, 2017) as a benefit to those Clubs who wished to voluntarily participate. An ongoing program has been established to continue to assist those clubs and future applicants. A 68-page Handbook (Rose Houk) was printed and made available on the "Members Only" side of the website. It includes an overview, how to become Incorporated as a Nonprofit with the State Michigan and the application process for the 501 (c) (3) with the required forms. Eighteen clubs joined the initial filing with

17 achieving group status. Ten additional clubs have started their packets for 2017. Seminars have been held at the Conventions.

- 2. State of Michigan Charitable Gaming Rose Houk, Retired Attorney met with State officials to determine eligibility requirements for local club Raffle Licenses. Michigan Garden Clubs, Inc. is a qualified organization. Each local Club can now file forms independently. "Guidelines for Achieving Qualified Organization Status (Under the Bingo Act)" was authored by Rose Houk.
- **3. Board In-services** were instituted to provide background information in-house: Edward Castellani of Fraser Trebilcock Lawyers; Kathy Oviedo of the State of Michigan Charitable Gaming; Rose Houk, Retired Attorney on 501 c 3 group exemption State of Michigan and Federal rules and regulations; Sarah Pinder about the Michigan Nonprofit Association: Charley Bohland, Webmaster on the MGC, Inc., website, and Board Members on their chairmanships.
- **4.** Website Debut/Digital Identity/Logo The contract was signed on July 13, 2015 with Pioneer Digital Services and the new website was officially opened on October 1, 2015 by Charley Bohland, Webmaster. The new website company had to meet the following criteria: Reasonably priced, willingness and enthusiasm for working with Michigan Garden Clubs, Inc., easy to contact after the site was up and running, have secure backup servers with daily backups, have two T1 lines so speed should never be a problem, have designers and graphic designers on staff for consultation. The goals were to have a website which was user friendly, easy to navigate and provide information both to the public and "Members Only." As part of the package, a **new digital identity** was chosen by the committee (Deannie Picciotti, Lynn Miller, Karen Motawi, Sue Wittick and Charley Bohland.) New information was added such as job descriptions, photos of Board members, Former President's Book was digitalized and Convention histories. Dropbox was tested to secure records and archives. As of 2/15/17 a new Board Member level was constructed. **Logo triad** updated (Sue Wittick, National Convention Program Chair) created clean, crisp NGC, Central Region and MGC, Inc., Logos.

Convention Histories (National, Central Region Garden Clubs, State) catalogued on website Facebook (Betty Assmann) continued as a resource.

- **5. New Garden Clubs:** Southfield Parks and Garden Club (DI), Bedford Flower and Garden Club (DIIA), Petals and Planes Garden Club (V), and Garden Pals of Portage Senior Center (District III)
- **6.** Ater NGC inquired about State Butterflies, Michigan is one of three states that does not have a State Butterfly. The **Black Swallowtail Butterly** was recommended through research by Bees, Birds and Butterflies Chair, Chris Lapinski as it stays in Michigan throughout its life cycle unlike the Monarch. Susan Leahy, Legislation Chair introduced the bill in 2016 (SB850) and 2017 (SB298) through Curtis Hertel (D) to the State of Michigan Senate. More support was needed for the Government Operations Committee to move the bill forward. Model Letters for Clubs to send letters to their representatives were established. The Black Swallowtail Butterfly Brochure (Chris Lapinski) and Lesson Plan (Peggy House) were developed.
- **7**. We became a **member of Michigan Nonprofit Association** on November 4, 2016 to have access to their workshops, seminars, information and rent free usage of their community room up to six times per year.
- **8. History** (Peggy Tully) 2015-2017 Michigan Garden Club Administration Report was filed with National Garden Clubs, Inc. **Bentley Historical Library (University of Michigan)**: Member Clubs were invited to archive their records at the Bentley.
- **9. Finance Restructuring** (Rosemary LaDuke, Treasurer and Patricia Ritamaki, Finance Chariman))Seber Tans was ratified to assist MGC, Inc., Treasurer in maintaining financials along with acting as Resident Agent and Warmels& Comstock, CPA Firm to audit. Services such as PayPal, Credit Card use, and an Assistant Treasurer position were added. Funds were reviewed for investment diversification.
- **10. Strategy Session** In this Installation and transitional year, a mid-winter (2.1.17) Strategic Planning Session led by Nancy J. Ryan, Workplace Transformation, Inc. was held jointly with the Executive and Finance Committees to establish a process for aligning MGC, Inc., to include vision, mission, goals, strategies and actions.
- **11. Garden Therapy** (Cyndy Nemon, Chair) created a Power Point combining Garden Therapy and "Plant It Pink" programs describing the history of both, MGC, Inc., and NGC's involvement. NGC became involved during WWII working with veterans. GT was prevalent during the 1950's with the development of asylums, many of which were self-sustaining farms worked by the patients. Farms also existed in prisons. Places in Michigan are

highlighted such as Dow Gardens, Midland and Meijer Gardens in Grand Rapids. Cyndy discusses her personal experiences working as an OT at Ypsilanti State Psychiatric Hospital. Plant it Pink has around since 2009 when NGC partnered with the Susan G. Komen Foundation to help raise funds and awareness for breast cancer and to combine the love of gardening. The PowerPoint has pictures from the Garden Club of Dearborn's projects. The goals of both programs are to connect people with nature while improving health and well being.

- **12. Shareholders' Reports** written by MGC, Inc., Officers were instituted to shorten Annual Meetings and be included in the commemorative program. Then, delegates and attendees can take the information back to their Clubs.
- **13. Profit Sharing** was introduced to provide financial incentive to host MGC events such as District and Presidents Meetings, State Conventions and Study Schools. Profits are distributed as follows: 50% MGC., Inc., 25% District and 25% Club(s).
- **14. 2017 Garden Clubs of the Year Award** was launched based on Club Size: Kent Garden Club, Meridian Garden Club, Landscapers Garden Club, Good Thyme Garden Club

STATE ACTIVITIES: Four Permanent Projects

1. Loda Lake Wildflower Sanctuary (Karen Motawi, Chair)

During the summer and fall of 2015, the old boardwalk was removed and a new one constructed in its place. The new boardwalk has rails on both sides and floats on the wetland so it will remain level over its lifespan. MGC, Inc., contributed \$9,000 for the lumber for this project and the US Forest Service provided the engineering and construction services as well as additional hardware. *MGC, Inc., docents* led several hikes through the sanctuary.

In early 2017, the Forest Service finalized plans for paving of the handicap walkways and improvement of paths leading to the boardwalk in order to make this section of the Sanctuary fully handicap accessible. In order for the Forest Service to accept the MGC, Inc., project match, it was necessary to apply for a Dun's number as well as a SAM number. A \$10,000 check was written to the USFS. This amount includes a \$2,000 withdrawal from the Loda Lake Endowment Fund at the Fremont Area Community Foundation. This project will be completed during the 2017 construction season.

Since June of 2015, MGC, Inc., members have contributed \$5,700 to the Loda Lake Designated Fund and \$870 to the Loda Lake Endowment Fund. Since the Foundation matches those contributions dollar for dollar, a total of \$1,740 was added to that fund.
