Planning Steps for a Memorial Dedication

Obtain guidelines and order forms from the NGC document located at <u>https://migardenclubs.org/blue-and-</u> gold-star-memorials.

Organize a committee. Select a chairperson and your site. Choose a marker: Blue Highway; Blue or Gold Memorial; Blue or Gold By-Way. If you choose a By-Way marker, consider dedicating both a Blue and Gold Star marker. Allow *seven* months for your marker to be delivered. Mail the official order application to Kathy Messner with a check payable to Sewah Studios. Open and inspect the marker as soon as it is received.

History

Based on the original Blue Star Flag, introduced during WW I and widely displayed in homes during WW II, the star became a standard symbol for National Garden Clubs' Memorial program in 1945.

The first Memorials paid tribute to the Nation's Armed Forces who served in WW II.

Through the years, the program expanded and today:

- Pays tribute to all men and women who have served, are serving, or will serve in the Armed Forces
- Honors families who have lost a loved one in service to our country

Markers

Highway Marker (Blue Star Only)

Permitted at rest areas on Michigan's statutorily designated Blue Star Memorial Highway

- Cost \$2,400 (*)
- Overall height is 7'6"
- Post is 7'H, octagonal, made of aluminum (a replacement post costs \$375)
- Marker is approximately 30.5"H x 46"W (the inside plate is 30" x 42"), made of cast aluminum
- Lettering is raised relief; emblem is modeled relief; the star is prismatic

Memorial Marker

(Blue and Gold Star)

Permitted on the grounds of National Cemeteries, Veteran Administration Medical Centers and any other appropriate civic location, as approved by MGC Blue and Gold Star Chair

All details of Highway Marker apply

By-Way Marker (Blue and Gold Star)

Permitted in parks, historical sites and other civic locations

- Cost \$765 (*)
- Plaque is 11.25"H x 20"W
- Lettering is raised relief
- Designed for mounting on masonry or wood
