The following Bylaw changes were approved by the MGC Board of Directors on April 7, 2022. The additions/revisions are underlined.

Revised MGC Bylaws

(Approved by the MGC Board of Directors April 7, 2022)

ARTICLE VII: DUES - Page 4

- 7.1 The fiscal year of MGC, Inc., shall be from June 1 through May 31.
 - 7.1.1 All dues are payable to MGC, Inc., on June 1 and delinquent after September 1 of each year.
 - 7.1.2 Member clubs and Associate Organizations failing to remit dues <u>October 1</u> shall forfeit membership and all privileges.
 - 7.1.3 After September 1, all new member information should be sent to MGC, Inc., but dues will not be collected for new members at this time.
 - 7.1.4 Dues for new members joining after September 1, shall be paid on June 1 of the following year and are delinquent after September 1 according to Article VII: Dues, 7.1.1.

ARTICLE XI: THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS - Page 6

- 11.1 The Board shall:
 - 11.1.1 Be composed of elected and appointed officers, District Directors, chairs of standing and special committees, the Advisory Council (Former State Presidents), and Chairs of the Michigan Consultants Council and Michigan Association of Accredited Judges.

District Activities/ Membership Committee



Chair: Nancy J. Ryan, 1st Vice President/President-Elect

The 2021-2022 fiscal year represented the continued challenge of Covid but also the re-start of many in person activities across the state. Over 500 members attended the in person Fall District Meetings. The District Directors did an outstanding job working with host clubs to support the fall gatherings following the local guidelines to provide a safe and comfortable environment.

The use of Zoom Meetings has proven to be a valuable tool to conduct business and connect with our member clubs. At present there are 136 Member Clubs and approximately 4700 members. There was a loss of five clubs and membership shrank statewide by 2%.

For the year the Membership focus has been continued improvement in the annual club roster process in the spring turning to Membership Recruitment efforts for the remainder of the year.

The individual summaries from each of the seven District Directors follow.

District 1: Director Anne Ryan

I felt like Perry Mason's private detective Paul all summer trying to track down and make contact with the 29 Garden Club Presidents in my District.

Because the club rosters were not due until September 30, I had no idea who was President of each club. This took a lot of time and phone calls, add to that, summer vacations and some Clubs having co-Presidents and one club having 3 people sharing this job, it was rather challenging. In addition, I worked on organizing the Fall District Meeting that my club was hosting, which involved picking a theme, finding a date that worked for everyone, negotiating the price, the menu, acquiring our tax-exempt paperwork, designing the invitation, the program nametags, and center pieces, organizing the hostesses and preparing the budget and final Budget.

Then came sending out the survey, following up on the survey and tabulating the results.

Planning Spring leadership conference was next which was pretty much the same as Fall Meeting. I also facilitated clubs in my district with monthly Zoom meeting and updated rosters with new and deceased members. Add to this monthly District meetings, Executive Board meetings, Regular Board Meetings and Central Region Board meetings as well as writing 4 articles for the MGC newsletter *Thru the Garden Gate*. I have been busy.



District 2A: Director Mary Moore

The Roster update process was sent to each club and completed.

District 2A had a great Fall Conference held in October 2021.

Asked each club to appoint a Roster Manager.

Presently planning the Spring Leadership Conference on April 22, 2022.

Acquired pictures and memorials for the MGC Annual Conference.

Planning for the Fall District Conference in Adrian on October 14, 2022.

District 2B: Director Carol Grainger

Our district appointed and elected a new Director, Carol Grainger.

This was a year that 2B was assigned to coordinate and host the MGC 2022 Annual Conference. Since this District functions with a Steering Committee, it was in full command with a Coordinator and partial team to work on the Conference. The Clubs within our District took on different tasks to pull the annual event together. All clubs were very cooperative and engaged.

Our District hosted a Tri-fresher, 2 flower shows, a Symposium, and a District Meeting.

This spring, District 2B decided to join another District for the Spring Leadership Meeting.

District 2B lost one club and members remained strong in all the other clubs.

District 2B Steering Committee and Club Presidents meetings were conducted monthly with Zoom and attendance was steady.

Along with the monthly informational meetings, we published a quarterly report to MGC and a District newsletter.

Two clubs were awarded the Plant America Award. As a wrap-up for our District, things are going well, and much is already in the works for the next program year.

The abundant activities and achievements of the nearly 800 members of the 30 garden clubs of District 3 in SW Michigan highly impact their membership and community. Limited space allows me to highlight only a few.

The Kalamazoo Garden Council was nationally recognized, and attended, for their sponsorship of the first all virtual Zoom MGC Gardening School held in 2021.

The Petal Pushers GC and Landscapers GC dedicated a Gold Star Memorial at the Air Zoo Museum in Kalamazoo.

Additional garden walks, community plantings, environmental speakers, plant sales and giveaways,

growing eatables, arbor day youth projects, holiday cheer for shut-ins, etc. are on the Michigan Garden Clubs District 3 Facebook page and the individual club's website and social media sites.

The festive Fall District 3 meeting, hosted by Chula Vista GC in Plainwell, was well attended with everyone enjoying a day of speakers, shopping, and sharing gardening stories.

Fernwood Botanical Gardens was the wildflower backdrop for the *Spring District 3 Grow + Share + Connect Leadership* meeting, hosted by Indian Hills GC, for clubs to share solutions and ideas on being a strong spirited club. Club connections increased with monthly Club President's Zoom Sessions coordinated by me, a privileged District 3 Director.



District 4: Director Carol McGregor

The 15 Garden Clubs of District 4 had a challenging 2021 year while emerging from a pandemic and starting to hold club meetings and events again. They started holding in person or hybrid meetings and continued with their outdoor Community projects.

After MGC held a successful Zoom Convention, it was decided to hold the District Fall Meeting in person, hosted by the Kent Garden Club. Wow,

what a turn out we had and everyone was smiling and happy to see their garden club friends at last.

Following that event, most clubs started to have fall events and Christmas parties, often wearing masks. However, winter and now Spring, has brought us together planning our summer outings and projects and we held a Spring

Leadership meeting in Whitehall/Montague in May hosted by the Dirt Daubers Garden Club.

Looking forward to 2022 being a busy and productive gardening year.

District 5: Director Dorothy Sandoval

The fiscal year began with updating the 22 club Rosters and 929 members in District 5.

Meetings were held to plan the Fall'21/Spring'22/Fall'22 District meetings. Other meetings included DD meetings with 1VP, Executive Committee and Board meetings.

Club President Meetings were established and the meetings are held every six weeks to support the leaders and share information.

Data collection included a survey to find out what's most important for club presidents to continue leading their clubs into the future.

Club photos were collected to be used at the MGC State Conference, a listing of events were gathered to showcase what clubs are doing around the state, and presidents were asked to submit the name of deceased members during the fiscal year to be memorialized at the State Conference.

Club President Reports were compiled and submitted to the 1st VP and President of MGC.



President's Zoom meetings have been held on a regular basis.

Newsletters are sent to District 6 Presidents on a regular basis.

The Spring Leadership Meeting was held in Mount Pleasant in April sponsored by the Evening Bloomers Garden Club.

Several District 6 Zoom and in person planning sessions have been held for the 2022 Fall District Meeting on October 12, 2022 which will be hosted by the Caro Garden Club.

District 6 had one club, The Evening Blossoms Club of Breckenridge, resign. District 6 currently has 359 members.

The group looks forward to the 2022-2023 and the continued return to in person events. The use of Zoom Meetings to support MGC and Club meeting and events will also continue.

District 6: Director Kathleen Sauber

District 6 appointed Sue Hendrix as District 6 Treasurer.

The Roster Process for District 6 was completed for all 15 clubs before the deadline.

The Evergreen Garden Club of Midland hosted the Fall District 6 Meeting in Midland on 10-2-21, attended by 60 members.

District 6's Midland Council hosted Environmental Studies School Sessions 3 & 4 in Midland in October& November 2021.

Civic Affairs Committee

Black Swallowtail Bill: HB5642 Annual Report:
On December 14, 2021 Rep. Brixie introduced HB
5642 with Rep. Lilly as co-sponsor, to make the
Black Swallowtail Butterfly the official state
representative of all pollinators, i.e., Michigan's
state butterfly. The bill was assigned to the Natural
Resources and Outdoor Recreation Committee and

on March 17, 2022 club members were invited to attend a committee meeting, to introduce and testify on behalf of the bill.

A delegation led by, Rep. Brixie, Included MGC members, fourth graders of the Okemos
Montessori School, their parents, and teachers,
Jeanette Meyer, MGC Legislative Chair, Sue Leahy,
and a representative of the 4th grade class
testified at the hearing. Jeanette and Sue gave the
conclusions of research and studies as to why the
Black Swallowtail would benefit Michigan's
agriculture, currently and into the future and
differences of other butterflies.

Sue gave the history of the butterfly and the school representative pointed out to the committee that Michigan is one of two states without an official butterfly and asked that we not be the last! Iowa is the other state without a butterfly.

As a committee member pointed out, lowa beat Michigan for the Big 10 basketball championship. Let's not let them beat us in naming an official state butterfly!

It is very important that we keep our letters of support going to the Natural Resources and Outdoor Recreation Committee members, especially its chair, Rep. Howell. Rep. Brixie's staff have pointed out that it is incredibly important that we continue to remind the committee members of the importance of HB5642 as the Black Swallowtail is a perfect representative of pollinators which are so necessary for Michigan crops.

Loda Lake Wildflower Sanctuary <u>Karen Motawi, Chair</u>

Since June 2021, I have submitted quarterly articles to *Thru the Garden Gate* about the sanctuary as

well as listing donors.

Contributions of \$7,317 have been deposited and thank you notes sent to donors, families of those remembered through memorial gifts and individuals honored through donations.

One check for \$605 was paid out for materials used by the Forest Service to build a footbridge in a wet spot on one of the trails.

The balance of the <u>Loda Lake Endowment Fund</u> held at the Fremont Area Community Foundation is \$54,942 with a current spendable balance of \$7,500.

The MGC Loda Account balance is \$12,500.

I met with United States Forest Service personnel to discuss needs and future plans.

I gave 2 PowerPoint presentations over Zoom, including a Friday Member Meeting on planning a trip to the sanctuary.



Education and Schools Committee

I was appointed to the role of Third

Vice-President in December of 2021 and was elected to the position at the April 2022 Board of Directors meeting.

Since December, I have overseen the updating of the Consultants list for each school. Please review your status if you have not already done so. Michigan Consultants Council and Michigan Association of Accredited Judges have reorganized into committee form.

I wrote an article called, "Why Participate in a School," for use in newsletters and am happy to discuss its content in club and district meetings.

I also produced a tri-fold brochure about NGC schools.

Environmental School Chair: Bethany Goodman

Michigan Garden Clubs, Inc. (MGC) has encouraged the environmental educational arm of the organization throughout Michigan since the early 1990s. MGC presented its most recent Environmental School, hosted by Midland Garden Council, by presenting Course 3 in September and Course 4 in October 2021.

Professional and college educational experts presented course topics and field trips on ecology, plant biodiversity, environmental science, backyard wildlife habitat, networking/outreach, historic environmental actions and leaders, sustainability in the general realm as well as specific Land, Air, and

Water areas of interest and concern.

Eleven students completed the course work and are now recognized by National Garden Clubs, Inc. as consultants, bringing the total to eighty-six consultants state-wide.

Gardening School Chair: Denise Clegg

Gardening School completed its Series 21, Courses 3 and 4 during the fiscal year. Presented totally over Zoom, the school was attended by members and nonmembers from across the country.

All test takers passed each course with an average score of 92%. Taking the test is not a requirement of any school for attendance.

In Michigan 22 new consultants completed all 4 courses. Some completed courses in other states or at the NGC sponsored course and recently achieved consultant status.

By presenting virtually we were able to have well recognized speakers from other areas of the country without incurring travel expenses. Highlights of the School were:

- Dr. Todd Barkman, Biology Professor, Western Michigan University spoke on Basic Botany;
- Author, Barbara Schaedler spoke on Propagation;
- International recognized speaker, Mark Lonstroth spoke on *Growing Fruit*;
- Local gardening expert, Linda Whitlock took us on a virtual tour of her home garden; and
- Nationally recognized, Carol Allen spoke on Nomenclature while keeping all present attentive.

Landscape Design School Chair: Ruth Moline

Landscape Design School found itself with new leadership this fiscal year with Ruth Moline assuming this responsibility. It took some time to achieve an organized structure and confirm documentation for all consultants.

Records for consultants, provisional consultants and students are being kept in a new format making it easier for all to send attendance data to school chairs across the country by using NGC Form 6, Application for Consultant Accreditation and Form 7, Application for Refresher.

The update to the consultants list was completed in March 2022. If you are a consultant, you should review it for accuracy on the website. Course 3 was presented in October 2021 and course 4 is scheduled for May 2022.

Landscape Design School has provided 2 speakers for the upcoming August 2022 Refresher course. Look to the website for details as soon as they are finalized.

Michigan Association of Accredited Judges Representative: Mary Jo McElroy

What is MAAJ? It's a group of 50 members – National Garden Clubs (NGC) Accredited and Student Judges -- aptly named Michigan Association of Accredited Judges. They are the dedicated people who encourage, support, educate, and evaluate NGC flower shows across the state.

MAAJ's purpose is to ensure that floral design, competitive horticulture, and botanical arts are woven into educational, leadership, and

informational events throughout Michigan Garden Clubs, Inc.

Annual accomplishments of this team included:

- Reconstituting as a Committee under MGC's Third Vice-President;
- Arranging for 10 invitational floral designs to be featured at the American Peony Society's June 2022 convention in Ann Arbor;
- Planning a continuing education event (aka Symposium) for September 13-14, 2022 for interested parties; and
- Establishing a Michigan Platinum award to be given to an MGC State or District Standard Flower Show that includes three or more educational and/or youth exhibits.

There were four quarterly newsletters during the year, with issues published in June 2021, September 2021, December 2021, and March 2022. The issues were sent via Constant Contact, published on the MGC website, and mailed via USPS to members without email addresses.

This year themes were established for each issue. Summer featured Wildlife and Pollinators; Fall highlighted Trees, Shrubs; and Youth Activities; Winter included Spring gardening and Seeds; and Spring presented Horticulture and Landscaping. This effort to use themes for each issue was somewhat successful but it may take another cycle to sharpen those efforts.

Regular features were the President's message, calendar of events, *Homegrown National Park*Record, District highlights, and Recruitment/
Retention articles. Other officers and committees submitted articles in their areas of interest.

Using Constant Contact reduced the USPS mailing costs over the year to an average of \$479 per issue. Unfortunately, only about 40% of Constant Contact recipients accessed their issue. Hopefully more will use this service in the future or view the newsletter on the website.

Awards Committee

The award year began with some significant changes in the National Garden Club Award Program. Some awards were eliminated, many renamed and combined. NCG also introduced scoring rubrics for each award. This information was published in a new GC Award Handbook, which looked very daunting in the beginning. NGC offered Zoom training on the new procedures which MGC in turn offered on a Monday Morning Meeting in July and August 2021.

I began receiving 2021 Award Applications in August. Most were sent electronically and in the beginning some problems arose with printing which was quickly corrected by our webmaster.

On October 25th we had a full day of Award and Yearbook judging. Approximately 35 MGC members were in attendance for this job and completed it in one day. Approximately 40 MGC and 42 NGC awards were judged in addition to 24 yearbooks, five Garden Walks and three Award of Honors. During the last year 18 Member Achievement Awards were presented.

MGC/NGC Scholarship Karin Maupin

MGC has had a very successful 2021-2022 Scholarship Season. All fifteen universities participated which is the first time we have had 100% participation.

Seventeen students received MGC scholarships totaling nineteen thousand dollars plus the MSU Burleigh Horticultural Scholarship brought our total budget to eighteen students and \$21,000 plus. There is still \$1,000 in the budget that will be awarded to our MGC choice for the NGC program if they do not receive a scholarship.

Notification was sent to Bill.com the first week in January.

All MGC scholarship students were invited personally to apply for the NGC scholarship and their agents were alerted. Eight students applied and sent their materials in by February 1.

A committee was formed to evaluate the applications and met Friday, February 18. All participants were evaluated using a rubric based on the NGC guidelines. Students and universities were anonymous to members of the committee.

Members of the community, college graduates, young, old, gardeners, teachers and professional landscape employees made up the selection committee.

All materials concerning our NGC pick had to be to NGC by March 1. **Chloe Summers** was awarded the NGC, Inc. **Osa Mae Barton Scholarship**. Monies are awarded in July.

Finance Committee

Chair: Gail Taggart

In addition to reviewing budgets and final reports of School and District events, the Finance Committee has wrestled with a variety of topics. Many have been resolved and others remain to be worked through.

Our bookkeeping and accounting processes are a burdensome and time-consuming task for our Treasurer and Financial Assistant. In order to reduce the load, we met with our CPAs at Seber Tans and developed a plan to further automate and out-source some functions. The plan is being implemented in steps.

The 2022-2023 budgeting process, involving members of the Executive Committee, District Directors, and appropriate Committee Chairs was completed, timely. The resulting Budget was presented to the Board in April and approved.

Our 'crime/dishonesty' insurance coverage was expanded to include a larger number of Board members, rather than be limited to the President and Treasurer.

Grants, investments and GTEP are tracked and reported on regularly.

The investment subcommittee met virtually with our investment advisors and are reassured by their commitment to proactive oversight of the assets we have entrusted to them, especially during the current market volatility.

Member club's ability to 'get out and get going' on new projects has been difficult as we work our way out of pandemic constraints. In spite of that, \$1,800 in Grow and Share grants were awarded to eight new projects. To date, \$9,161.96 has been awarded to forty-six projects under this program.

Policies and Procedures were revisited and revised on the subject of monetary Remembrances in the event of a death in our Board and/or current or past Presidents.

Our *Grow and Share Grants* program was extended to allow a \$400 amount for Blue/Gold Star Memorial installations.

Progress continues in the effort to define and document the systems and actions involved in our Scholarship program.

MGC Group Tax Exempt Program (GTEP) Chair: Rose A. Houk

The 2021-2022 renewal and new club application process is now complete.

Twenty-eight clubs are currently members and all have renewed their Affiliation Agreements and filed the appropriate forms with the State of Michigan and with IRS in the Group Tax Exemption Program. Each of the clubs has indicated a continuing interest in maintaining membership in the Program.

As chair of the Program, I reviewed bylaw changes, reviewed the documents required for filing with both IRS and the State of Michigan. I also presented Zoom meetings to discuss changes that should be made to bylaws to assist with the pandemic issues of being unable to hold meetings in person.

I look forward to assisting new clubs in joining the group next year.

- Collected, tracked and processed deposits and expenses for MGC Events, Schools, Committees, and Officers.
- Issued Monthly Treasurer Reports showing MGC finances.
- Coordinated the filing of various IRS and State of Michigan taxes, reports and licenses.
- Continued to streamline MGC accounting and reporting processes.

No additional expenses such as reimbursement for stamps or mileage were incurred.
